The Hagerstown and Frederick Ry was an electric railroad in central Maryland. It started as several different companies, included the Frederick & Middletown THE HEART OF Railway; Hagerstown Railway; MARYLAND Washington, Frederick & Gettysburg ROUTE Railway, as well as several other small  $\hat{0}$ companies that had been started by those railways or area investors. Eventually the railway was renamed the Potomac Edison interpret this important part of our local Company.

From 1896 until 1958, Trolley cars were a common sight in Frederick, Hagerstown, and other towns in the area. They carried

mail, and goods to and from stores and farms, as well as Passengers.

The Trolleys helped to shape the communities in the area. The HFRHS was formed to help to preserve and heritage for future generations.
